I was concerned that my children were not keeping up with the UK school curriculum and felt like I'd totally exhausted myself trying to create an exciting January 'homeschool' for them from scratch while also maintaining my work role at MAF HQ.

What a difference a year makes! There are now two other little girls in MAF, one of whom will be in starting in Rosie's class next week. Currently they speak very little English (they come from Denmark) but they are ace den-builders and lego-engineers (which is far more important). It has been an absolute gamechanger for me in terms of my 'inner life' (anybody else feel like their head is a bit of a carousel most of the time?) and a wonderful way to connect with and learn from a range of missionary ladies. God is real and He REALLY loves us.

I'm loving working in Cairns, Australia, but missing the family. It's incredible what you can get done when the internet works decently! It's amazing how much joy doing your job as you've been trained to do it can bring when you're not also fighting peripheral issues.

The school end-of-year celebration saw both kids gain awards (presented by their father, a school governor) and Rosie reprised the role of Mary in the nativity.




