PNG fuel shortage

Since early February we have had problems getting fuel for our aircraft in PNG. There was a press release saying the fuel company would not be operating for much longer. MAF PNG Management have ordered 8 shipping containers of fuel drums from New Zealand, but at double the PNG cost per drum.

At the time of writing, MAF has approximately 6-8 weeks of fuel left in PNG and we are reducing our number of flights to make fuel last longer so we can keep doing high priority and emergency flights in case this fuel crisis is not resolved quickly.

Please join us in praying for a quick and cost-effective solution to this fuel crisis so we can continue to serve the poor & isolated in PNG.
