In November Liz and Joel had the chance to go back to Juba and join in the 10 year anniversary celebration of Juba Christian Academy, where Joel was one of the first students back in 2014. proud mother of 5!





This was our house in Hai Cinema- how normal it felt to be back at the place we used to call home! Yet times have moved on and several families have called this building home since we left. We treated this visit as a "goodbye" to the once-familiar house.

There are some changes at Hai Cinema since we left Juba. The pool is now a proper swimming pool, not an over-ground tub; the play-ground equipment is updated; the road outside is now paved and the small shacks and café situated on the adjacent street have disappeared. We also missed the familiar faces and voices of those who were once our neighbours and friends who, like us, have moved away. We took at peek at the building once used for Joel's school- the Juba Christian Academy. The school used a couple of rooms in this place, before moving across town:



Although Joel and I took a taxi cross town to visit Hai Cinema, we actually stayed at the Guesthouse at the newer MAF compound. The "new" compound, now 7 over years old, was not completed when we left Juba, so it was amazing to stay there and see how beautifully it has been built. It is bursting with life- fruit trees galore, plants and birds- and several families serving with MAF in Juba! It is a testament to God's provision and the faithfulness of God's gifted visionaries who imagined this place and worked hard to make it happen.





Juba Christian Academy- 10 years on! Ten years ago, the school began with a handful of children. When Joel joined in 2014, there were just 5 children of pre-school age. Now it is a thriving community of 20 plus students, offering classes for children of all ages up to Grade 5 (age 11).





Joel and I loved being part of JCA's 10-Year Birthday celebrations! We saw many familiar faces, including our pastor from our time in Juba, who took part in the speeches. Perhaps you can spot Joel in his 2014 and 2015/16 class? The cake was also delicious...

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On Sunday, Joel and I visited the church we used to attend. The building they currently use had been double-booked- but there was no worry about rain under South Sudan's sunny skies, so we met under a tree instead!



I discovered old friends, including the worship leader, who led us in beautiful praise without the help of electricity (power went off half way through a song!). It was moving to be with friends old and new, including a missionary from Aweil who had been with us during the tense moments at Quality Hotel back in 2016. "God is so faithful", he smiled, as we shook hands. I couldn't agree more.
