Each day, Clare invites the local children to pre-school at our house. She does their ABC, 123, and cooking together with all sorts of other activities



MEDEVAC (Medical Evacuation) almost daily Paul saved many children, men, and women, who needed rescuing from the Jungle

Not only do we help with spiritual matters, but physical too. If MAF does not fly, people die. We fly seven days a week if necessary to rescue people from the hazards of Jungle existence. This little boy fell out of a tree whilst spearfishing and landed on his own spear. He lived after we flew him to Wewak Hospital

The year started with a volcano erupting off of Wewak where we live. The volcano is still pouring out volcanic ash 12 months later. This was shortly followed by huge earthquakes which we all felt, but the southern highlands were the worst affected. The disaster recovery flying is continuing. We are on 24-hour Tsunami alert here in Wewak.

Not all flights continue to the end of the day. Just after lunch in the highlands, Paul landed to deliver disaster relief aid to this very remote village. However, the rains came immediately after landing and did not let up. Paul spent a night with the villagers after walking for 35 minutes through the jungle to their bush huts.



Bible sales increased dramatically in 2018

We sell around 30 Bibles a day alongside Eyeglasses, Solar Audio Bibles, Concordances, and Jesus DVD's



This ministry is one of the best. Supplying Bible to people who have no access to The Word is an example of the hunger for people have for Jesus and this ministry offers the hope they have been waiting for. For those who cannot read, we sell a Solar powered Audio Bible in Tok Pisin. All these products are sold at an affordable rate. MAF alongside CRMF pays the balance.

Missionaries

This Missionary John Hutterman of New Tribes Mission is one of Paul's Frequent Flyer's last year

Here in Wewak, we support many missions, large and small. New Tribes (NTM) is one of the largest whereas Pacific Inland Mission (PIM) are smaller and wholeheartedly dependant on us.

We fly many missionaries into the Jungle, supply them with a food lifeline, and medical evacuation
