23 young children were saved from danger by a special MAF flight with Pilot Eivind Lindtjørn.

'I will always remember one particular flight. A friend called to say she knew of some children who were in danger in a nearby town, where fighting had broken out.

'I had lots of flights scheduled for the day but we had to bring them to safety somehow – and before dusk when the light fades. Our ground crew worked hard to refuel the plane in between flights and make everything happen as quickly as possible. With limited internet and phone signals, and after lots of teamwork, planning and prayer, our efforts paid off and God brought it all together!

'It took 2 flights to fly all the children to safety before dark, but we did it! When the children arrived safely in Juba and got off the plane, they all hugged each other, feeling grateful and relieved. It was so touching to see.'

If you don't have any playdough, you could make some salt dough. (Make sure you ask permission first.)


Salt dough dries hard after a few days, so you can keep your plane!

- » ½ cup table salt (125g)
- >> ½ cup water (125ml)
- Food colouring (or you can paint your plane when it's dry instead).

Don't eat the salt dough — it tastes yucky and won't be good for you!
